Station Setup

CTS-DDN hardware setup is best performed before mounting the station. (Figure 2)

- Addressing: Each CTS-DDN button must have a unique address on 1. the DDN Network. Utilize DIP Switches 1-6 to set the address. (See Address Setting Chart) On 2-button stations the DIP Switch sets the address for the top button while the station automatically applies the address + 1 for the bottom button. For example, if address 3 is applied the top button the bottom button is automatically set to address 4
- Mode: Ensure DIP Switch 7 is in the "On" position. 2
- 3 Network Termination: Two devices on the DDN Network should be set for network termination. If the Controller is the end-of-line, terminate the Controller and the device at the opposite end of the network. If the Controller is positioned at a mid-point on the network, terminate devices at the opposite ends of the network either side of the Controller. To terminate CTS-DDN set DIP Switch 8 in the "On" position.

Testing

Test CTS-DDN for power prior to mounting.1

- Connect power to the CTS-DDN. 1.
- 2. Press an On/Off button to confirm the station emits an audible chirp.
- 3. In the event the chirp is not audible confirm power by way of the Power LED. When power is connected the LED will illuminate solid green. The LED is visible from a small opening atop the CTS-DDN back box. (Figure 4)

- Fasten to switch box with the 2 provided #6/32 screws. 2.
- 3. Install cover plate.
